Firstly, on behalf of the Faith City community we pass on our deep sympathy and love to Elizabeth, Zion, David and Sally for the loss of their husband and father.

Daniel was an experienced principal, being Tumuaki of Arahunga where he led the school through a period of outstanding growth and development. His foresight and vision for students with disability was very insightful and he had an amazing strategic ability to bring that vision to pass. He was held in high esteem by the other Special School principals in New Zealand for his knowledge and ability. Many sentiments were also discussed and passed on between the principals in Whanganui regarding his ability and vision.

Daniel had a huge impact on Faith City School. Firstly, as a student at Faith Academy where he was the only student to be award the Pastor's Cup – the top prestigious award at the school, twice – the only time this has been accomplished. Daniel was then to make his way back to Faith City as a teacher, before going on to principalships in other schools. More recently he was appointed as a Board of Trustees Rep and was appointed Board Chair at the beginning of 2020. His vision for the school was one of the need for a Christ centered curriculum and one where all Christian parents could bring their children to the school. Daniel was an outstanding Board Chair and a significant support to me as Principal.

Daniel is a man who walks the Christian talk, he is kind and generous. He is very intelligent and patient with it. Daniel has a creative, quirky sense of humour. He will be greatly missed.

Elizabeth has asked me to pass on her gratitude and thanks for the amazing support she has received from everybody. Your love has meant a huge amount to her and her family and she is deeply appreciative for all you have done.

I know our community are committed to Elizabeth and their family's ongoing support. We are blessed for Daniel's time with us and blessed to have a hope of eternal life with him soon.
