Room 3 – Pasifika Countries

In Room 3 we have begun learning about the different Pasifika peoples who live on the Pacific Islands of Tonga, Fiji, Vanuatu, and the Solomon Islands. We are working in groups to find out the following information:

- Their flag,
- Map of where the island is in the Pacific,
- Traditional clothing,
- Traditional food,
- Traditional housing and current house styles,
- Celebrations that are important, and
- Anything else that the children are interested in learning.









Room 6 – Multiplication Cities

Room 6 are making cities using their understanding of arrays for multiplication.









Room 5 – Decimals

In Room 5 we have been tackling decimals head on. We have been learning how to count in tenths and hundredths. Now we are ordering, comparing and rounding decimals. We also understand that decimals can be put on a number line just like fractions.

Yesterday we used a calculator to count up and back in tenths. Adding money, measuring temperature and using millimeters on a ruler are all real life examples of how e can use decimals.

We are going to continue our whole class study of "Decimals to Tenths" in the next few weeks, which combines powerpoints, videos, discussions, practice sheets and goup problems solving problems.

Room 4 - Tennis

Room 4 students have been training at the Whanganui Tennis Courts for the last three weeks in preparation for their super six racquet sports day this Thursday.

This year Faith City School won an award for our participation in the 20 Hour Famine. It is The Compassion, Ngākau Aroha Award; for showing kindness and compassion in your community and beyond in this year's World Vision 40 Hour Famine. Our senior students took on the challenge together. And on Tuesday 10th August World Vision came to school and presented our students with the trophy.

Altogether our students raised \$3,328.80 for children in sub-Saharan Africa. That's enough to provide 126 families with a chicken in sub-Saharan Africa!

We have also received information regarding the Kiley Family Memorial Trust Scholarships for Secondary and Boarding Scholarships.

The Kiley Family Memorial Trust was established by John and Peter Kiley in August 2000 with the purpose of assisting students to meet their secondary education costs in New Zealand.

Secondary Scholarships are awarded to assist students:

• To pursue their secondary studies in the field of agriculture or who have included agriculture in their field of study

• Who plan to attend Taranaki / Whanganui Schools or Wellington based Catholic Schools in 2022.

Preference is given to students from less well-off backgrounds who would otherwise have difficulty paying their school fees and meeting other school costs.
