From the Principal's desk

Greetings to you our Faith City school families

Pasifika Celebration Day - As part of our Theme study on the Pacific, we held a Pasifika Celebration Day in the last week of the Term - it was a fantastic day for our children, and everyone involved. It certainly was a significant highlight this year. The students got to see an umu being prepared and cooked and then feasted on the Pasifika style food. They learnt Pacific action song, Pasifika Art, creative lei, Samoan storytelling, and Fijian spear throwing. The kids played volleyball. The students' presentations were outstanding. It was such a great day. Thank you to our Pasifika families who gave up their time and expertise to make the day such a success.

Cross Country - We also held our annual cross country – which again was a success as all the students participated and tried their best despite the lockdown interrupting their preparations. The parent support from the side-line was really encouraging despite the restrictions at Level Two. Congratulations to the 2021 cross-country year level winners and place getters.

2021 Prizegiving - This year, due to level two restrictions, we are going to livestream our Junior and Senior prizegivings. Many schools are cancelling their prizegiving, but we will endeavour, with support from Faith City Church, to hold ours and allow you to sign in to view the livestream. Only parents with an invite into the streaming site will be able to view the prizegiving. This is for privacy reasons. We will endeavour to allow at least one of our Year 8 parents to attend - hopefully both depending on numbers.

Vaccine Mandate – Shortly, schools will receive guidance as to how the vaccine mandate is going to apply to education workers. The government wrote a Public Health Order that makes the mandate law and enables them to enforce that order. At this stage, we have not been instructed by officials - we only have had basic information around when the workers must be vaccinated by and the keeping of a register. It will also likely mean that there are specific rules around who can enter the school grounds and how this is done – such as contractors and parents etc. In the meantime, please keep following our Level Two procedures.

Given the increased uncertainty we are all facing at present, it is good to remember that God is still working out His sovereign purposes. Psalm 46 is a great encouragement to us and the opening and closing verses, a comfort - I have copied them below:

Psalm 46:1-3, 10-11 "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore, we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling. Selah" "Be still and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations; I will be exalted in the earth!" The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress. Selah"
