We are due to be given some guidelines around what schools will be required to do under the traffic light system. What I have been told is that there won't be a lot of changes to how schools are being asked to function at the moment. For now, we need to keep up with social distancing and parents wearing masks on site, at the gate and only accessing classrooms for students who need support, as well as QR coding in. All parents can come to the office, if necessary. You don't have to be vaccinated, but if you can phone in or email, that would be helpful. I really don't like that because having you around on site is great – however – we do have to do all we can to keep our tamariki safe. Our next piece of work will be contact tracing in the event of an outbreak at school – I will fill you in in more detail about this in due course.


The grand prize
