The Big Day In Teacher Only Day

Last Friday, over 200 teachers and support staff from across 15 different Christian schools and Early Childhood Centres in the Lower North Island, met online (and in their own schools) for what was to be the annual 'Big Day Out.' Thanks to Covid restrictions, this became the 'Big Day In.' Keith Newman was the keynote speaker that day. Keith is the author of, 'The Bible and Treaty' and 'Beyond Betrayal' amongst other publications. He is regularly asked to speak on the influence of the bible in the formation of our nation following the arrival of the missionaries in Aotearoa.

His presentations included, 'Bible and Treaty: Reclaiming Christian History' as well as the provocative title, 'Colonial Con or Chiefly Charter.' With such meaty topics, there was no shortage of questions and enlightening discussions that followed!

Keith did an outstanding job of sharing many inspiring stories of the rich heritage that Christianity has in our nation. This helped to restore a more balanced appreciation for the significant influence that men like the brothers **Henry and William Williams** had in forging strong relationships with the Maori community. What was interesting to note, is the fact that many Maori quickly embraced the gospel and were far more influential in sharing the gospel across the country than European missionaries!


Edge App - Info & Setup

We are moving away from Skool Loop for submitting any absences for your child/children and will be using the Edge App. This App enters information directly to the database that the school uses so your child's teacher and the office staff will be able to see any absentees that you have sent via the App. You can also view Payments which will show any charges on your account and you can also receive Notifications (short messages) from us about upcoming events etc.
