In Room 2 we have been creating Penguin Art.
















Room 3 - Acrostic Poems

Room 3 has been learning how to write alliteration and simile while writing acrostic poems. Here are some examples of our work.








Room 6 - Budding Artists

Room 4 - Table Tennis & Netball


Room 4 students have been enjoying their table tennis training each week.
