I was really blessed to see so many parents attend the parent info session on Keeping Ourselves Safe. Your support has been a real blessing as we navigate tricky ground around abuse. The stats on abuse of children in NZ is horrific. This course will certainly give our kids tools that they can use to help themselves and others if needed. If just one is helped, then I think us doing the programme is well worth it. I have sat in on several of the sessions and I have been amazed at how our students have participated and have picked up the ideas around how they can keep themselves and others safe. One of the messages in junior school has been, "My body is mine and I am in charge of my body." I liked what one of our little FCS fellas said to his mum when she said it was bath time. He replied to her, 'My body is mine and this body doesn't want to have a bath!' Out of the mouth of babes!

Parent interviews are coming up quickly. Please ensure you get in soon and book a prime time for your interview. The interviews are very important as you will receive specific information about your child's progress this half year and get information about what they need to be working on etc. Please do bring your student with you to the interview - especially in Rooms 4 - 6 where our students should be present in the interview.

In the last week of Term, we will hold our Cultural Celebration Day. We will open the classrooms for parents to come and see the student presentations. Our students are thoroughly enjoying preparing this for the day and would appreciate seeing you all here. We will have a shared lunch together as a school. Students will get the opportunity to try a range of cultural dishes prepared by some of our parents who come from other countries. The kids will also be competing in some cultural games during the day such as Ki orahi. Thank you to all the parents who are preparing food for the day.

Mia constructed a New Zealand History cave with her customers. Inside were some activities and information on Early New Zealand life.


Eli reorganised the PB4L Zone, creating meaningful activities on friendship, kindness and respect.


Breakfast Club
