FCS CROSS COUNTRY 2025



The Faith City Cross Country will be held on Tuesday, 19 August 2025. Racing will start at 1pm. See the schedule below. Races will start on time and be followed with the Prizegiving.

This year the students have been practicing the track they will run. The track distances are the same as for the West Schools Cross Country distances. You can see the tracks and distances on the map provided. Year 8's and up will run the hill which is a very good challenge for the kids and will help them prepare for Westmere's race.

Racing will not be postponed for weather – bring a towel to dry when changing back to uniform.

All parents are required to stay on the concrete pad or behind the gate.

It is our goal that all students run their race without stopping – please encourage this goal with your children.

Selections for the West School's and Aranui will be made from the FCS Cross Country event.


You may sign your child out once their race and Prizegiving has been completed. Please do this with their classroom teacher. Otherwise, students will return to class after their event.

We also looked back at the chapters before his reign and learned about his father and grandfather, whose choices were far from godly.


We were amazed and encouraged by what an 8-year-old (2 years younger than some of us) can accomplish with God's help!
