

Room 1 Highlights



Room & Highlights

Room 6 has really enjoyed learning about the Pacific Islands this term. One of the highlights was experimenting with printmaking, where students created artwork inspired by Pacific patterns and designs. They also researched a Pacific island of their choice, uncovering unique traditions, stories, and facts to share. The class loved presenting their projects to each other and to the wider school, and it was wonderful to see their confidence and pride shine through. Term 3 has been full of creativity, lots of teamwork, and new learning opportunities!!

We have also enjoyed reading stories that celebrate our shared Pasifika culture through School Journals, and news articles. These texts have been a fantastic way to build our reading comprehension and fluency while learning about different cultures and ways of life. Students have had great discussions about similarities and differences with their own experiences, deepening both their understanding of the stories and their appreciation of the Pacific. This term we have introduced 'fluency buddies' where children pair for 15 mins every morning and take turns reading a familiar text we have been studying together during the week.
